

Mount Heng, located in Hengyang City, Hunan Province, within the Nanyue District, is one of the Five Great Mountains of China. Its main peak, Zhurong Peak, is surrounded by seventy-two peaks, forming a majestic landscape that appears as if soaring. It is renowned worldwide for its unique beauty among the Five Great Mountains, as a sacred mountain for worship, a holy place for religion, the "Longevity Mountain of China," and a profound cultural region. The name "Mount Heng" originates from the divi-sion of the constellations, specifically from the Yuheng star sion of the constellations, specifically from the Yuheng star in the Zhen constellation, hence the name Hengshan. Being the southernmost of the Five Great Mountains, it is also called Nanyue. As one of the Five Great Mountains, Mount Heng's history spans over four thousand years since the era of Yao and Shun. Emperors and legendary figures such as the Yan Emperor and Zhurong are said to have resided here. Emperors throughout the ages either sent emissaries or came in person to worship
